6 Days

**DAY 1 ALBUQUERQUE / LAUGHLIN**

We drive west across the colorful deserts of northern New Mexico and Arizona. We cross the Colorado River to enter Nevada and reach Laughlin where we lodge one night.

**DAY 2 LAS VEGAS / DEATH VALLEY**

We drive to the new Hoover Dam bridge, then to Las Vegas for a short visit before continuing to Death Valley. As we approach Death Valley, we enjoy the panoramic view from Zabriskie Point. We lodge three nights at Furnace Creek Ranch in the heart of Death Valley. Ranger programs are held nightly at the nearby Visitors Center.

**DAYS 3 & 4 DEATH VALLEY**

During our 2 full days in Death Valley we see many attractions and vista points: Scotty's Castle, Devil's Golf Course, Badwater (lowest point in the U.S.A.), Harmony Borax works, and more. We can also hike short trails in Mosaic Canyon and Golden Canyon and take the Salt Creek Interpretive Trail.

**DAY 5 DEATH VALLEY / FLAGSTAFF**

We drive out of Death Valley and continue south through the Mojave National Preserve. We reach Flagstaff, Arizona this evening to lodge one night.

**DAY 6 FLAGSTAFF / ALBUQUERQUE**

We tour Flagstaff's 13,000-square-foot Riordan Mansion, built in 1904 by a local lumber baron. After lunch in the Turquoise Room of the fabulous La Posada Hotel in Winslow, we continue to Albuquerque, viewing the beautiful scenery from a new perspective.
