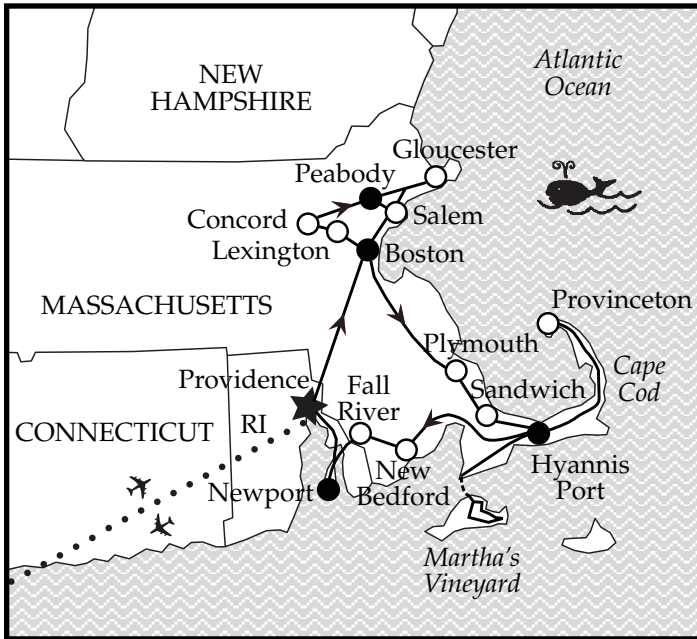

DAY 1 HOME / BOSTON

We fly to Providence and transfer to our downtown Boston hotel where we lodge two nights.

DAY 2 BOSTON SIGHTSEEING

Boston is the vibrant center of New England commerce and cultures. Our city tour features many of the historic attractions along the Freedom Trail. We visit the Old North Church and Trinity Church and the Skywalk Observatory of Prudential Tower for a view of the Boston area from 50 stories high. The rest of the afternoon is free to begin our exploration of the city.

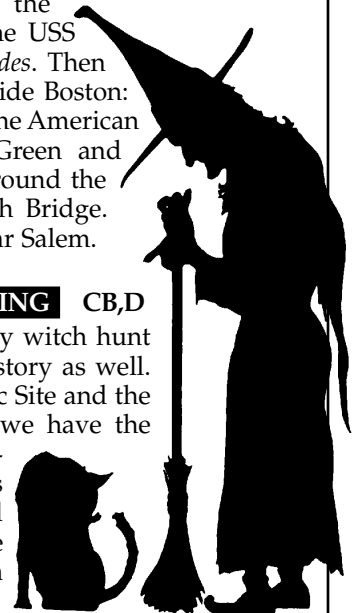

DAY 3 LEXINGTON / CONCORD

We cross the Charles River to the Charlestown Navy Yard to visit the USS Constitution, nicknamed *Old Ironsides*. Then we drive to two historic cities outside Boston: Lexington, where the first battle of the American Revolution took place at Battle Green and Concord, where the "Shot heard around the world" was fired at the Old North Bridge. Two nights' lodging in Peabody near Salem.

DAY 4 SALEM / WHALE-WATCHING CB,D

Salem is famous for its 17th-century witch hunt but has lots of other fascinating history as well. We visit the Salem National Historic Site and the Witch Museum. In the afternoon we have the option of either a 4-hour whale-watching cruise or to visit Salem's Peabody and Essex Museum and The House of the Seven Gables. We gather together in Gloucester for a lobster dinner.

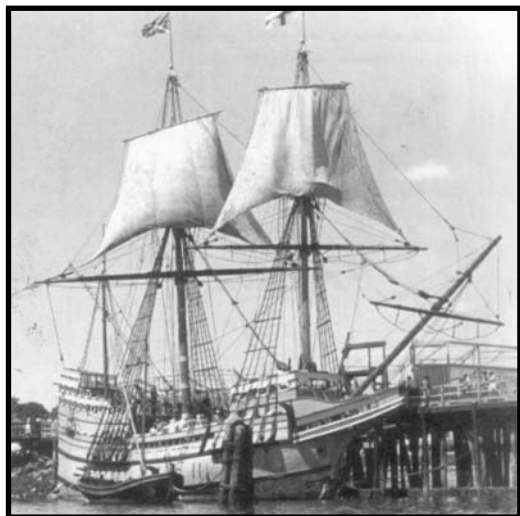


DAY 5 PLYMOUTH / SANDWICH

CB,D

We drive to Plymouth to visit the legendary Plymouth Rock and *Mayflower II*, an exact reproduction of the original *Mayflower*. At Plimoth Plantation we visit with the pilgrims in a recreated 1627 pilgrim village. In Sandwich, the oldest town on Cape Cod, we visit the Sandwich Glass Museum to see 5,000 pieces of Sandwich glass and a demonstration of glass making. Three nights' lodging at the beach on Cape Cod near Hyannis Port.

DAY 6 CAPE COD / PROVINCETOWN B

Our journey across Cape Cod starts in Hyannis, famous as home of the Kennedy family. At the Cape Cod National Seashore Visitor Center we learn about the geologic origins of Cape Cod, its wildlife and vegetation. We continue to the Cape's tip at Provincetown seeing pristine beaches and windswept dunes along the way. Provincetown is a charming artist colony with a maritime history. We return to our beachside hotel with free time to soak in the sounds, sights and smells of the ocean.

DAY 7 MARTHA'S VINEYARD B,D

We take a ferry to Vineyard Haven on Martha's Vineyard to begin our tour of the island. Highlights include: the gingerbread-decorated Methodist cottages of Oak Bluffs, historic Edgartown, the county seat since 1642 and the special scenery and atmosphere that have lured the rich and famous for generations. We return by ferry to Cape Cod for a special harborside dinner.

DAY 8 SHIPS AND MANSIONS B,L

We cross the Cape Cod Canal to reach New Bedford, once a great whaling port. The New Bedford Whaling Museum brings the heyday of whaling back to life. In Fall River we take a sentimental journey on the Battleship Massachusetts and other World War II era ships. En route to Newport, Rhode Island we stop at the Green Animals Topiary Gardens. In Newport we tour Cornelius Vanderbilt's 70-room summer cottage, "The Breakers," the finest of Newport's mansions. Two nights' lodging in Newport.



DAY 9 NEWPORT POTPOURRI CB

Newport is one of America's most fascinating cities with a unique blend of colonial buildings, seafaring history, colorful shopping wharves, rugged coastline, and 19th-century mansions. After a city tour that features the Bellevue Avenue mansions and Ocean Drive, we visit Trinity Church, built in 1726. After free time to visit the specialty shops on the restored wharves, we enjoy a Victorian living history tour at "Astor's Beechwood Mansion."
