

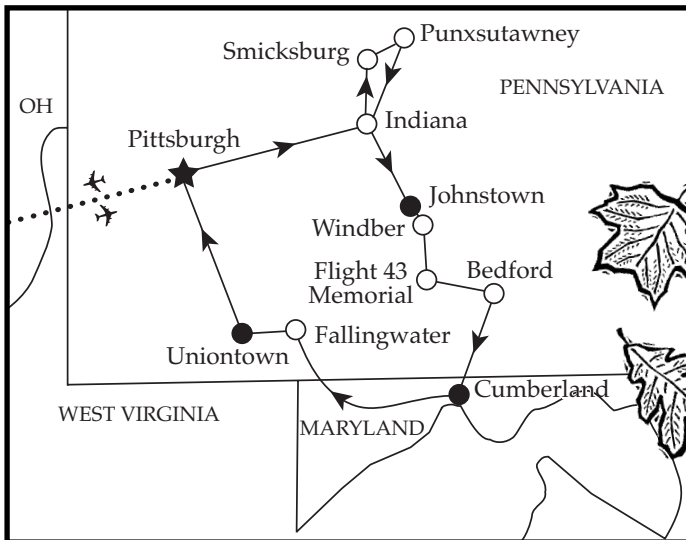

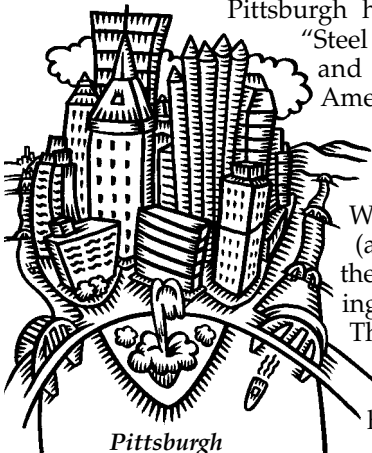


## DAY 1 HOME / PITTSBURGH

We fly to Pittsburgh. Driving to our hotel we pass rolling Pennsylvania countryside then emerge from a tunnel into a spectacular city of light, shining on the banks of three rivers. Three nights' lodging at the Omni William Penn, a classic historic hotel in the heart of downtown Pittsburgh.

## DAY 2 PITTSBURGH SIGHTSEEING

Pittsburgh has transformed itself from "Steel City" to one of the cleanest and most beautiful cities in America. Our morning tour includes Pittsburgh's highlights as our local guide tells us Pittsburgh's stories. We take the Duquesne Incline (a 145-year-old cable car) to the top of the bluff overlooking Pittsburgh. What a view! Then we have free time to explore Pittsburgh's revitalized downtown from our hotel's central location.



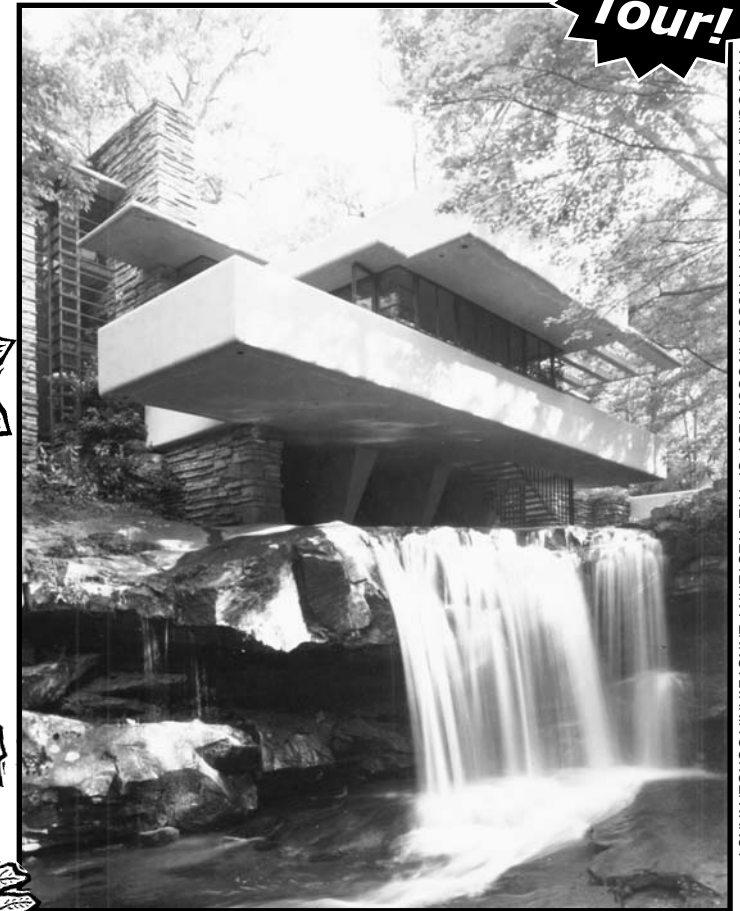

## DAY 3 FRICK CENTER / PITTSBURGH

At the Frick Historical Center we tour industrialist Henry Clay Frick's home, the Frick Art Museum, and the Carriage and Vintage Car Museum. After seeing the Phipps Conservatory and Botanical Gardens, one of America's finest, we tour the Heinz History Center which features the history and heritage of the area.

## DAY 4 JIMMY STEWART / AMISH / "PHIL"

We drive into the lovely Pennsylvania countryside to the city of Indiana, hometown of Jimmy Stewart. A local guide shows us the town which is remarkably like Bedford Falls from *It's a Wonderful Life*. At the Jimmy Stewart Museum we learn about Jimmy's own wonderful life through exhibits and film. Then we drive to the Amish area of Indiana County, watching out for buggies along the way. In Smicksburg we savor a family style meal typical of an Amish Wedding Feast while hearing about the simple way of life and customs of the old order Amish. In nearby Punxsutawney we meet Phil, the famous groundhog, and members of the "Inner Circle" at Phil's burrow. A local guide takes us to Gobbler's Knob, site of the annual ceremony. Then we continue to Johnstown to lodge two nights.

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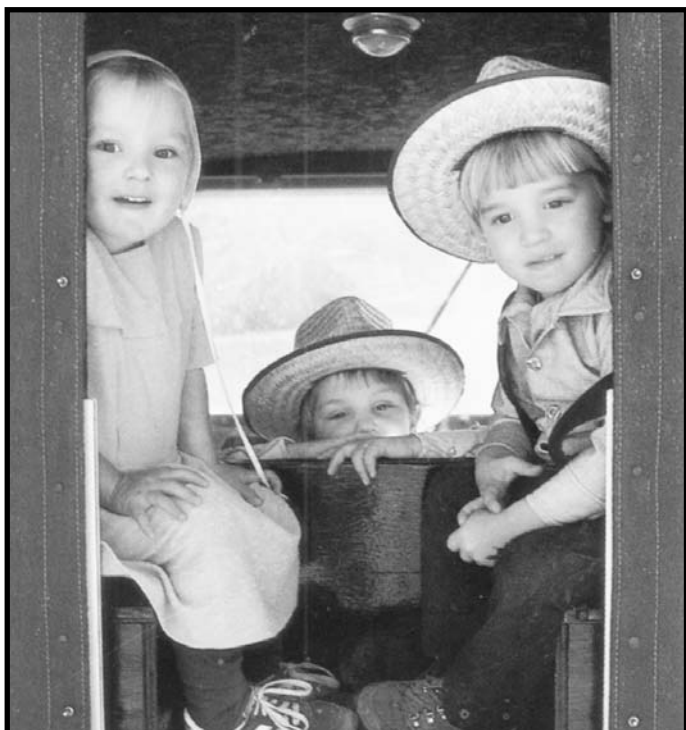

**DAY 5 JOHNSTOWN SIGHTSEEING L**

Johnstown sits in a deep valley, adding drama to the scenery—and to the flood risk. The famous Johnstown Flood of 1889 was the worst flood disaster in America's history. We learn all about the flood and this historic city (once America's largest steel producer) on a full-day guided tour. We visit the Johnstown Flood Museum then ride the Johnstown Inclined Plane up 900 feet at a 72-degree grade (the steepest in the world) to a dramatic view and lunch at the top. We also drive out to the Johnstown Flood National Memorial at the site of the dam whose failure sent a 40-foot wall of water down the valley to Johnstown.

**DAY 6 FLIGHT 93 MEMORIAL / BEDFORD L**

We learn about Pennsylvania's coal mining and the miner's life at the Windber Coal Heritage Center. Then we pay our respects at the new Flight 93 National Memorial Plaza, honoring the brave passengers who prevented a greater tragedy. Lunch in Bedford at the Jean Bonnet Tavern, built in the 1760s, is a special treat. A guided walking tour of Bedford brings the history of this charming village to life. At Old Bedford Village 40 structures built between 1750 and 1850 are gathered to demonstrate life in the old days. Then we drive into Western Maryland to lodge near Cumberland for one night.



**DAY 7 MARYLAND / FALLINGWATER CB,L,D**

Cumberland was the site of Fort Cumberland and the terminus of the Chesapeake & Ohio Canal. We tour the city and the "Tunnel" Church (built on the old fort). Then we drive through western Maryland's prettiest scenery and stop at the Spruce Forest Artisan's Village. We cross back into Pennsylvania and its lovely Laurel Highlands region to reach Frank Lloyd Wright's Fallingwater, "unquestionably the most famous private residence ever built." It exemplifies Wright's concept of organic architecture—the harmonious union of art and nature. Our comprehensive tour of the home and its beautiful setting is unforgettable. We follow the National Road (built 1811—1818) to Uniontown where we lodge one night.

**DAY 8 PITTSBURGH / HOME CB**

Depending on our flight schedule, we may have time to tour the historic area near Uniontown before driving back to the Pittsburgh airport for our flight home.
