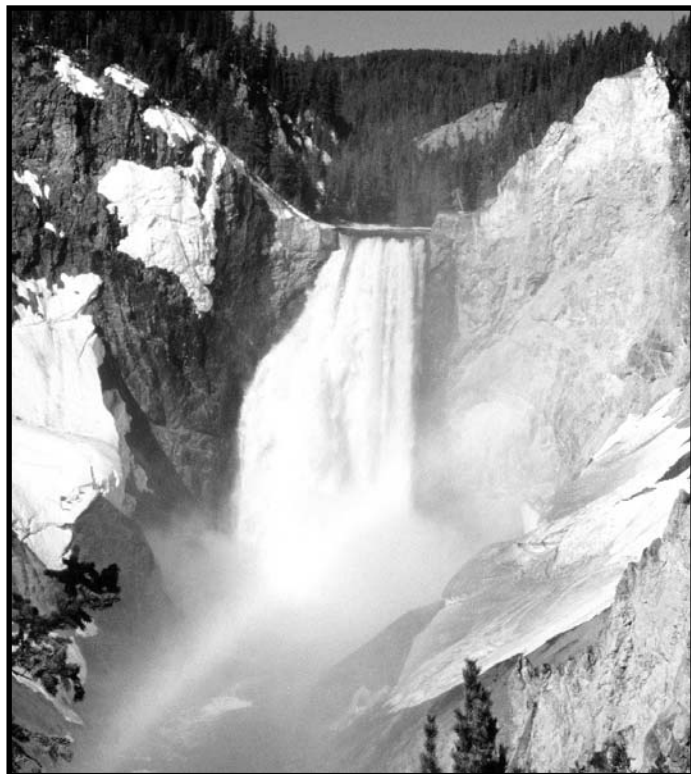


DAY 1 HOME / DENVER

DAY 2 WYOMING / THERMOPOLIS

We continue north into Wyoming, the "Cowboy State." The wide open sagebrush plains are broken by mesas and mountains. In Casper, the Historic Trails Interpretive Center tells the stories of travelers who passed by here on the Oregon, California, and Mormon Trails. We skirt the Wind River Canyon to reach Thermopolis, where we lodge one night. We drive through Hot Springs State Park, home of the state buffalo herd, then, soak in the natural hot springs pool at our hotel!

DAY 3 CODY / YELLOWSTONE

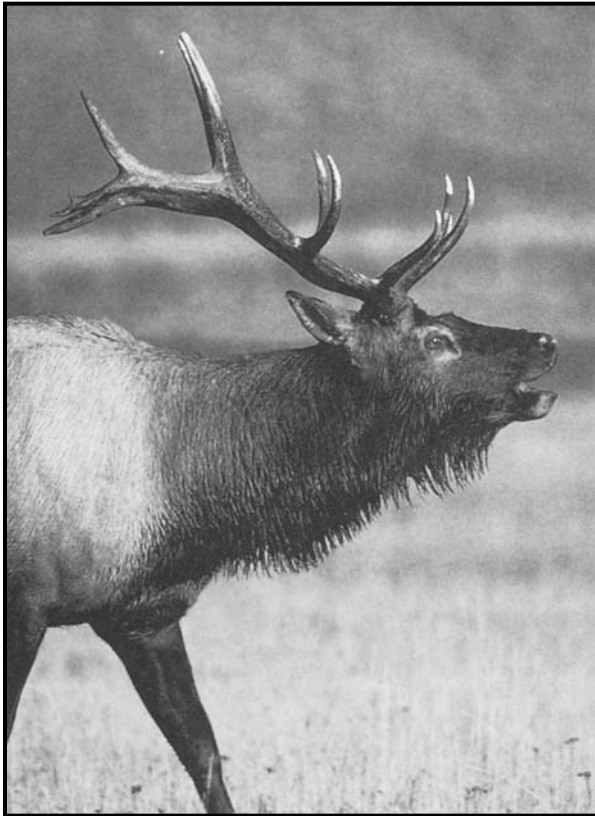

We take the scenic route to Cody, Wyoming, founded by Buffalo Bill himself. At the famous Buffalo Bill Historical Center, we see an unrivaled collection of western art, Indian artifacts, firearms, and Buffalo Bill memorabilia. Lunch is at the historic Irma Hotel, built by Buffalo Bill and named after his daughter. We drive into Yellowstone National Park where we lodge three nights.

DAY 4 YELLOWSTONE PARK

Yellowstone was America's first, and is still its most famous, national park. We see natural wonders like: mud volcanoes, the Falls of the Yellowstone River, Mammoth Hot Springs, geysers, emerald pools, and, of course, Old Faithful. Wildlife such as buffalo, deer, elk, and moose is always seen.

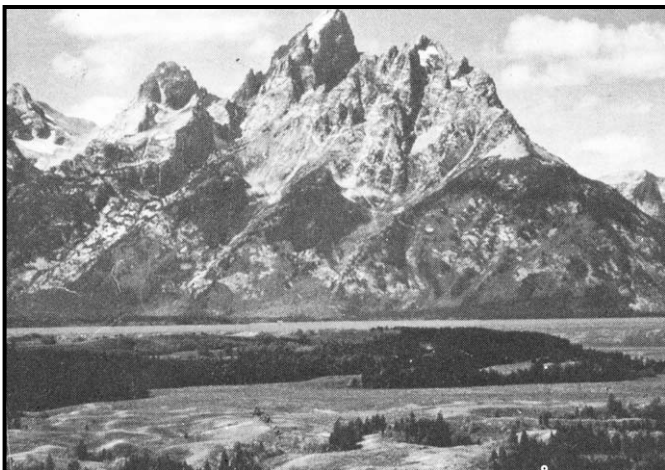


DAY 5 **YELLOWSTONE PARK**

We continue our sightseeing of Yellowstone with the Fountain Paint Pot, the Firehole Falls Loop, and the Midway Geyser Basin. Our afternoon is free to explore the Old Faithful area: watch Old Faithful erupt, walk trails to Morning Glory Pool, watch audio-visual programs, and join ranger-led walks.

DAY 6 **GRAND TETONS / JACKSON**

In Grand Teton National Park, the Tetons, with Jackson Lake in the foreground, is one of America's most beautiful views. An optional Snake River scenic float trip is available. In the afternoon we enjoy free time in Jackson, which has a lively atmosphere and the most fun shopping in the Rockies! One night's lodging in downtown Jackson.

DAY 7 **WYOMING / UTAH**

We cross the high pastures of western Wyoming and a corner of Idaho. Then we emerge from the mountains into Salt Lake Valley, just like the Mormons did in 1847. Two nights' lodging in Salt Lake City. Tonight we walk to nearby Temple Square to attend a rehearsal of the Mormon Tabernacle Choir

DAY 8 **SALT LAKE CITY / FREE TIME**

A professional Salt Lake City guide boards our coach to show us the Mormon Capital. We see Temple Square, the Union Pacific Depot, Cauldron Olympic Park, and much more. We visit the newly renovated State Capitol Building, "This is the Place" Heritage Park, and Brigham Young's Beehive House. This afternoon we can choose from many attractions, all within walking distance from our hotel: Family History Library, Heritage Museum, St. Mark's Cathedral, Clark Planetarium, and Temple Square.

DAY 9 **UTAH / RED CLIFFS LODGE**

We cross the mountains and deserts of central Utah, stop in Price to see the dinosaur museum, and reach canyonlands country near Moab, Utah. We stay one night at the Red Cliffs Lodge with its spectacular setting on the banks of the Colorado River, surrounded by sheer, 2,000-foot-high cliffs.

DAY 10 **MOAB / HOME**

We pass Utah's La Sal Mountains and Colorado's San Juan Mountains to reach New Mexico. The Shiprock, sailing in the desert, welcomes us home.
