DAY 1 HOME / SAN ANTONIO

We fly to San Antonio where we meet our local guide who introduces us to the city and shows us beautiful Brackenridge Park. We lodge five nights at the Drury Plaza Hotel.

DAY 2 CITY TOUR / ALAMO / MUSIC SHOW B,L

Our guided tour of San Antonio features visits to the Cathedral, the Steves Homestead in the King William Historic District, the Alamo, and the historic Menger Hotel. After lunch at the Menger Hotel, we enjoy a free afternoon to explore San Antonio. Tonight we attend the San Antonio Rose Live show at the Aztec Theater featuring the songs that made us fall in love with country music.

DAY 3 ATTRACTIONS / FREE TIME B,L

After enjoying an IMAX film which recounts the battle of the Alamo we visit the Institute of Texan Cultures. Lunch is served 60 stories high in the Tower of the Americas' rotating restaurant. Then we have another free afternoon to relax along the River Walk or visit nearby attractions like La Villita, Market Square, the Buckhorn Saloon & Museum, and the Spanish Governor's Mansion.

DAY 4 HILL COUNTRY FLOWERS / YO RANCH B,D

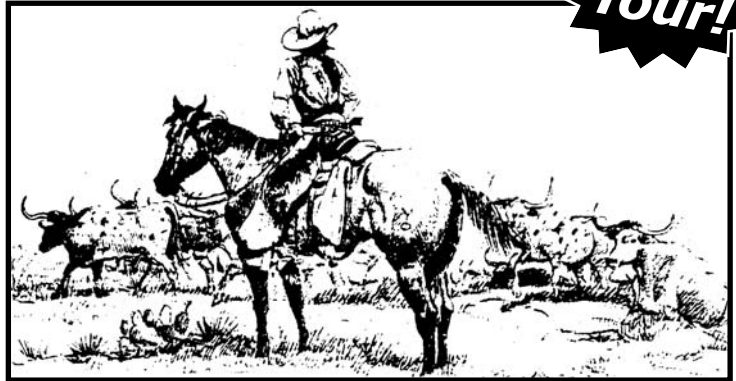
We drive into the Texas Hill Country where the bluebonnets and other wildflowers should be in full bloom. We see 200 acres of wildflower varieties at the Wildseed Farms, near Fredericksburg. A local guide tells us the stories of Fredericksburg's German settlers that arrived here in 1846 and the historic buildings that they built. After seeing the National Museum of the Pacific War we drive to the YO Ranch, 100 square miles of Texas where exotic animals and longhorn cattle roam free. After a tour of the ranch we join the cowboys for dinner at the "Chuckwagon." Then we drive "home" to San Antonio.

Our lodging for five nights is an elegant property housed in the beautifully restored Alamo Bank Building, which opened its doors to San Antonio in 1929. It features a prime River Walk location, hot breakfast, complimentary hot food and cold drinks each evening, a rooftop pool (at 23 stories, the highest in San Antonio), and a lobby with 50-foot high ceilings.

DAY 5 SAS SHOES / MISSION / FREE TIME B

We tour the SAS shoe factory to see how fine leather shoes are made. Then we follow the Mission Trail to San Jose Mission, the "Queen of the Missions" that was founded in 1720. This afternoon is our last free time to explore San Antonio on our own. A walk through the King William Historic District or a cruise on the San Antonio River would be fun.

DAY 6 SAN ANTONIO ATTRACTIONS / HOME B,L

At the McNay Art Museum we see world-class art in a Spanish Colonial-style mansion. The San Antonio Botanical Gardens are especially beautiful this time of year. Our sojourn in San Antonio comes to an end as we drive to the airport for our flight home.
