

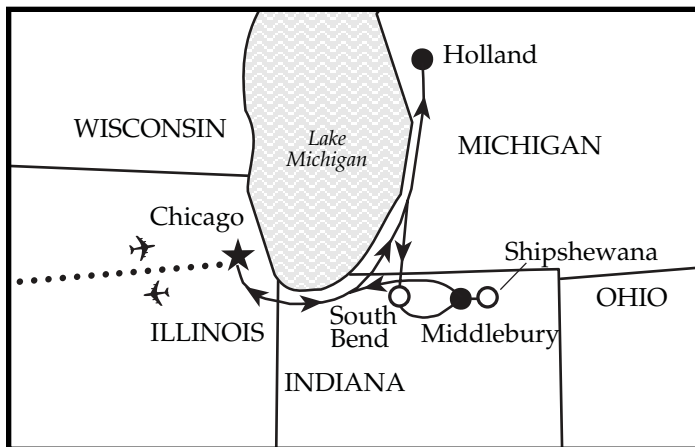
TULIP TIME & Indiana Amish

DAY 1 FLY TO CHICAGO / HOLLAND, MICHIGAN

We fly to Chicago and drive around the southern tip of Lake Michigan to reach Holland Michigan where we lodge three nights.

DAY 2 HOLLAND TOUR / TULIPS / KLOMPERS CB,L

Our local guide introduces us to Holland which was settled by Dutch immigrants in 1847. It's an All-American City with a Dutch accent. We drive along six miles of tulip lanes as we tour the downtown. After a church lunch we see the tulip fields at Veldheer Tulip Gardens. Tonight we go to Centennial Park where many hundreds of locals (Klomp Dancers), dressed in Dutch costumes and wearing wooden shoes, dance in procession along the streets.

DAY 3 WINDMILL ISLAND / VOLKSPARADE CB,D

We tour Windmill Island which features an imported Dutch windmill originally built in the 1780s—that still works! This afternoon the Volksparade begins with hundreds of street scrubbers followed by dozens of colorful floats and local bands. Dutch dance groups also "Klomp" along the route in authentic Dutch costumes. The Dutch Heritage Show tonight features over 50 enthusiastic performers presenting vignettes of life in Holland with song and dance.



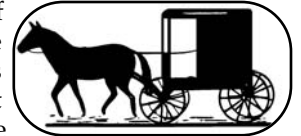
May 7 - 13, 2012 7 Days

DAY 4 NOTRE DAME / ESSENHAUS CB,L,D

We drive to South Bend Indiana, home of the Fighting Irish of Notre Dame. A student guide shows us the venerable campus including the Main Quadrangle, the Basilica & Grotto, the Library, and the Golden Dome. Then we join the students for lunch in the dining hall. At the Studebaker National Museum we see a priceless collection of carriages and motor vehicles built by Studebaker here in South Bend for almost 200 years. We lodge for three nights at Das Dutchman Essenhaus in Middlebury, Indiana.

DAY 5 SHIPSHEWANA AMISH TOUR CB,D

Our local guide is with us all day in nearby Shipshewana, the heart of Amish country, to tell us about the Amish way of life and to introduce us to its people. We make pretzel's at Jojo's, see how Amish carriages are made, experience a horse auction, and see woodworking and chime making. Our tour ends at the home of Carolyn & Henry Yoder where we ride in an Amish buggy, have a cooking demonstration, and savor a traditional Amish home-cooked meal.



DAY 6 MORE SHIPSHEWANA AMISH CB

At the Menno-Hof Mennonite-Amish Visitors Center in Shipshewana we learn about the life and beliefs of these religious communities and discover a slow-paced way of life that the Amish still enjoy. At the Hostetler Hudson Museum we see the largest collection of Hudson automobiles in the world. After free time (shopping anyone?) in downtown Shipshewana we visit an Amish farm where we see how the horses are harnessed and the fields are planted (weather permitting).

DAY 7 DRIVE TO CHICAGO / FLY HOME CB

It's been great getting to know the people of Holland, Michigan and Amish Country. Now it's time to return to Chicago and fly home with all the warm memories that we have gathered.
