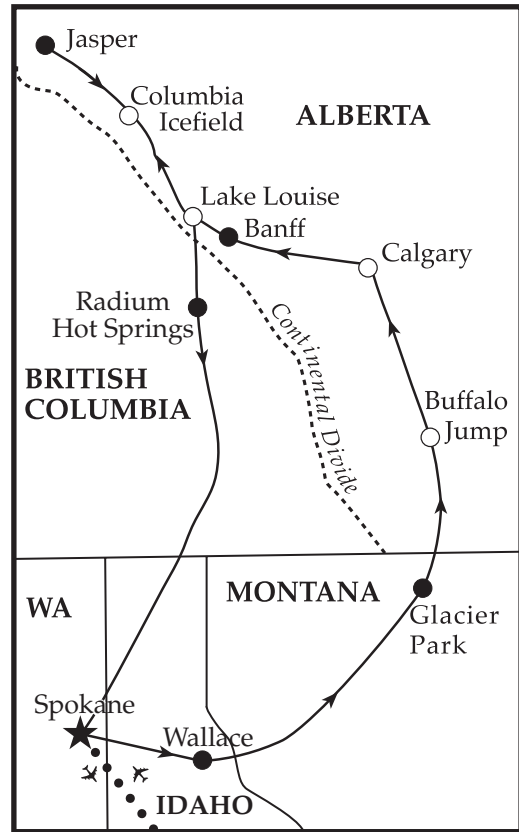
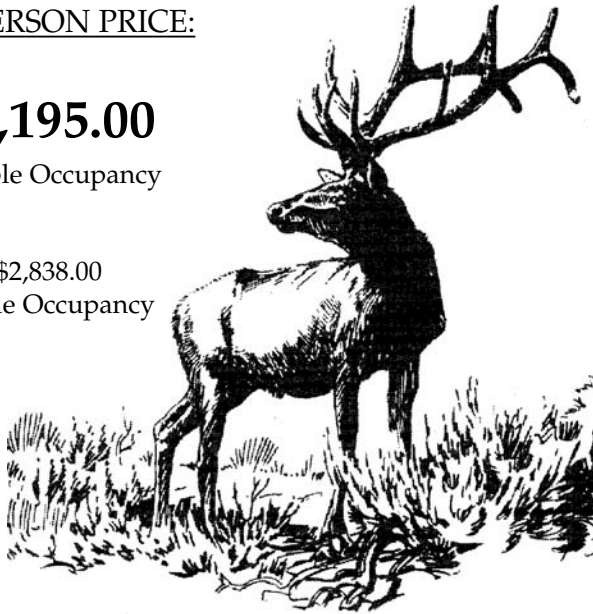

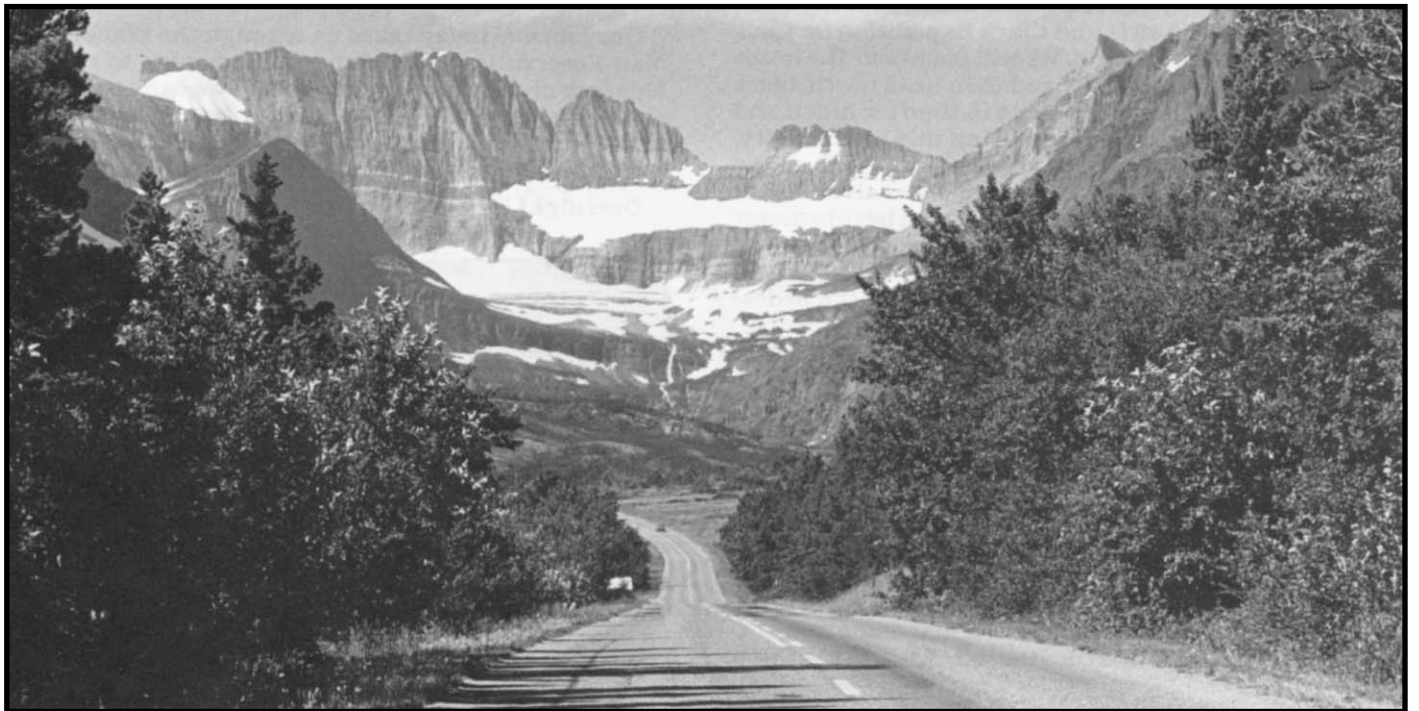

DAY 1 HOME / SPOKANE / IDAHO

We fly to Spokane, Washington. We board our waiting motorcoach and drive across Idaho's northern panhandle to Wallace where we lodge one night.

DAY 2 WALLACE / GLACIER PARK

Once the center of a rich silver-mining district, Wallace is now listed on the National Historic Register because of its historic architecture and character. We tour the tunnels in the Sierra Silver Mine to see how ore was mined. We drive past beautiful Flathead Lake to reach Glacier National Park, a million acres of beautiful high-mountain scenery. Our rustic lodgings (for one night) are inside the park at Lake McDonald where we enjoy the lakeside setting.



DAY 3 GLACIER NATIONAL PARK

Our drive through the heart of Glacier Park on the Going-to-the-Sun Road offers some of the most spectacular mountain scenery in America. A 1930's "jammer" (roll-top bus) takes us past glacier-carved mountain peaks, verdant valleys, beautiful flowers and majestic panoramas. At St. Mary's Visitors Center we learn about the park's geologic and human history and its wildlife and vegetation. We lodge in the park at the rustic Many Glacier Lodge. An evening walk along Swiftcurrent Lake would be fun.

DAY 4 BUFFALO JUMP / CALGARY

We cross the border into Canada and continue to the Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump where the Plains Indians herded buffalo over a cliff for thousands of years. In Fort Macleod, the Mounties' first headquarters, a guide orients us to the Main Street Historic District. We reach Calgary and view the metropolis from the Calgary Tower's Observation Deck, 600 feet up. Then we drive into the heart of the Canadian Rockies to Banff where we lodge two nights.

DAY 5 BANFF SIGHTS / FREE TIME

Banff is located where the Bow River cuts between Mt. Rundel and Cascade Mountain. We ride gondola cars up Sulphur Mountain for lofty views of this splendid setting. We then visit the Falls of the Bow River and the Cascade Rock Gardens. The afternoon is free time to visit Banff's vast selection of shops, explore the area, soak in the Upper Hot Springs, shop at the Banff Springs Hotel, or stroll along the Bow River.

DAY 6 ICEFIELDS PKWY / GLACIER RIDE

The scenery from Banff to Jasper along the Icefields Parkway is the most spectacular on the continent. Jagged, glacier-covered peaks confine us to a narrow valley. Wildlife is often seen along the way. We stop to see Peyto Lake's amazing turquoise color. The Columbia Icefield (the largest in Canada) is a mass of glacial ice astride the Continental Divide from which many glaciers flow. Conveniently the Athabasca Glacier comes to within one mile of the highway. Here we board a special large snow coach which takes us onto the glacier. We continue on the Icefields Parkway to Jasper where we lodge one night. Outside Jasper we visit Maligne Canyon whose narrowness and depth are astonishing.

DAY 7 JASPER / LAKE LOUISE

We drive south on the Icefields Parkway seeing the scenery from a new perspective. Lunch at the Chateau Lake Louise delights our palates while the world-renowned view of Lake Louise and Victoria Glacier delights our eyes. After free time to soak in the beauty of this lovely setting, we enter British Columbia at Vermillion Pass on the Continental Divide and drive through Kootenay National Park to the town of Radium Hot Springs where we lodge one night.

DAY 8 RADIUM HOT SPRINGS / SPOKANE

We drive through southern British Columbia, return to the United States in Idaho, and continue to Spokane where we lodge one night. There is time to explore Spokane's attractive downtown area from our lodgings at the splendid Davenport Hotel.

DAY 9 SPOKANE / HOME

We transfer to the airport and fly home with the beauty of the Rockies now turned into indelible memories.
